Anti-Social Behaviour in Fakenham

I have had separate meetings with the residents of both Mill Court and Red Lion Court, along with the police and representatives from Flagship Housing, to discuss residents' concerns about anti-social behaviour in their immediate neighbourhoods. It seems that a few individuals in Fakenham are causing misery to many others, making their lives intolerable and placing an unfair burden on residents. At the root of this issue is a failure to vet prospective tenants before they are placed among elderly and vulnerable residents and a failure to address the issue of substance abuse. I intend to escalate this matter with the police, North Norfolk District Council and Flagship Housing Association.

Broken Pavement Outside 6-10 Norwich Road

I have lobbied consistently on this matter as, in my view, the uneven pavement outside 6 to 10 Norwich Road, is not only an eyesore at the entrance to the town centre, but a clear danger to pedestrian safety. I am glad to report that Highways recently sent out the agreement for the works and agreed the extent of the land dedication and agreed construction drawings. The pre works meeting should take place soon with works following at a date to be agreed with streetworks. As these works are primarily a safety issue, I have urged NCC Highways to progress them quickly.

Fakenham Health Matters
